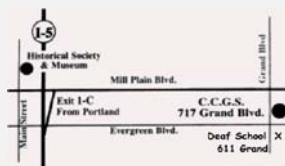

## **FIRST THURSDAY UNFOCUSED GENEALOGY DISCUSSION GROUP**

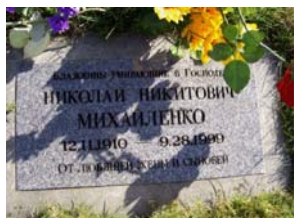

The first Thursday of the month is Larry Dean's regular day as librarian, so barring unforeseen circumstances he will be there to moderate the group's discussions. ## **Research and Preservation Workshop**

One of our Research & Preservation projects is that of having a web page for each cemetery in Clark County. We are trying to post photos of every gravestone in each of these cemeteries plus burial records. The Brush Prairie Cemetery has been adopted by CCGS member Richard Engstrom. The photos are finished now and we're trying to have the names on five of the stones translated to English for posting. ## **Greetings from the CC Legacy Users Group**

We have now met after our summer hiatus and enjoy being together again, working as a team on ways to use the many features of the Legacy genealogy program for computers. We continue to have great attendance at these meetings, the average being 20-25 of the approx. 50 members currently signed on. We have also begun posting the Tip Sheets created for the group on the CCGS website. From there, we can print them off in color, burn them to a CD for later referral, and also save CCGS some printing costs. These tips may be viewed by going to the Legacy page on the CCGS home website and clicking on the Tip Sheet Link. We have also posted a calendar of meetings for the coming year on this page, link at the top.

We meet the first Monday of each month, unless that is a holiday, from 10-noon in the Annex room at 717 Grand Blvd. Consider attending one of our meetings if you are looking for a good genealogy computer program to use or change to. Legacy offers a "free" version (a good price) that is fully functional and will record your genealogy material however you desire. It adapts to you, the user. A CD of the free program can be obtained at the CCGS library or we can give you one at a meeting. Legacy won't work on a Mac, but I do know of a very new program developed in Iceland that will work on a Mac or a PC and can give that information to you at a meeting.

## ***WANTED: VOLUNTEERS FOR THE LIBRARY***

In order to keep our library open, we need people who would like to volunteer as a librarian for a 3, 5, or 6 hour shift. We require two people per shift. If you wish, you can work a permanent day and time, which is still flexible for your vacations, etc. We normally start new librarians out working with two other librarians until they feel comfortable working with just one. Due to health problems, moving to other states, etc., we have lost quite a few of our librarians.
