Some history of the East Vancouver Methodist Church, Cal Sutherland, present pastor.

The first Mill Plain Class was organized September 1 1891 in a small school building midway between Fisher and Mill Plain.

Rev. A. J. Hanson, the Presiding Elder, in the chair. After prayer, S.S. Cook was elected Sec. Present, Rev. C. A. Snelling; Pastor Cook; A. Higdon; Geo. Coddard; F. J. Strunk; Frank McAfferity; Geo. A. Whipple; J. A. Towle; A. H. Nichols; E. Butler; H. Proebstel; A. Collings; G.J. Allen. Sisters: A. McCafferty; M.L. Allen.

Fishers Landing was once considered as a county seat site of Clarke County but no vote was taken. FISHER'S LANDING was founded by SOLOMON W. FISHER, in July 1851.

#### CLARK COUNTY, WASHINGTON

"What is now known as Clark County was originally called the District of Vancouver. It was established by the Oregon Provisional government on June 27 1844, and included all that part of Oregon lying north of the Columbia River. On Dec 22, 1845, the provisional legislature changed the title from the district of Vancouver to Vancouver County. On July 16, 1849, the Territorial Legislature changed the name from Vancouver County to Clarke County." Clarke was in honor of Capt. Merriweather Clarke of the Lewis and Clarke Exposition. Gen. Joseph Lane, first governor of Oregon territory, appointed William Ryan sheriff of Clarke County on Sept. 8, 1849. David Stone was appointed prosecuting attorney for the third Judicial District, which included Clarke, Clatsop and Lewis counties. The first election for county officers was held on July 1, 1850. A quarter section of land was granted for a county seat. Fisher's Landing was considered but was never voted on. The site finally selected was of the present site of Vancouver, but in the early days was called Columbia City. The first purchaser of a lot was John Kelly, for lot No 5 in block 2 on Oct 22, 1850, for \$1,000. But this land was claimed by the Hudson's Bay Co, and by the War Department, as part of the reservation and by Amos and later his heirs, and part of by the Catholic Church. After much legal debate a site was finally selected and on January 26, 1855, the name was changed to Vancouver. A contract was given to C. C. Stiles to build a courthouse on Feb 18, 1854, to cost \$983. This building was used as a military barracks for the volunteer force, in the Indian war of 1855-56. S.D Maxon was given a contract to build a jail.

The act establishing Washington Territory, from the then Oregon Territory was passed on March 2, 1853.

There were five U. S. land offices in Washington Territory; Vancouver, Olympia, Walla Walla, Spokane Falls and North Yakima.

### CLARK COUNTY HISTORY

Many of the events which shaped Clark County and Vancouver history was do to the controversy between the British at Hudson's Bay and the American settlers, who were moving to the area across the Columbia River. This accounts for the frequent name changes. Besides being called Clarke, and Clark, the county was once also called Vancouver. The original plat called for the name of Vancouver. But the postmaster general was prevailed upon to change the name to Columbia City, because the Oregon Territory's delegate to Congress, Samuel R. Thornton, disliked both the British and British names. Columbia was also the name of the new military post. In 1853 the name was changed back to Fort Vancouver Barracks. After the territory of Washington was formed from Oregon Territory at the Columbia River, Columbia City was the name given to the county seat of Clark County. Then in December, 1855, the name was changed back to Vancouver and was incorporated on January 23, 1857.

All of these name changes should be kept in mind, when one is researching this area.

According to the census taken by Joseph L. Meek in 1850, there were 95 houses in Clark County, 15 of which were in the Military Post. There were 359 people. In April, 1851, the population of the county was 644. The present population, as of January 1, 1974 is 153,300.

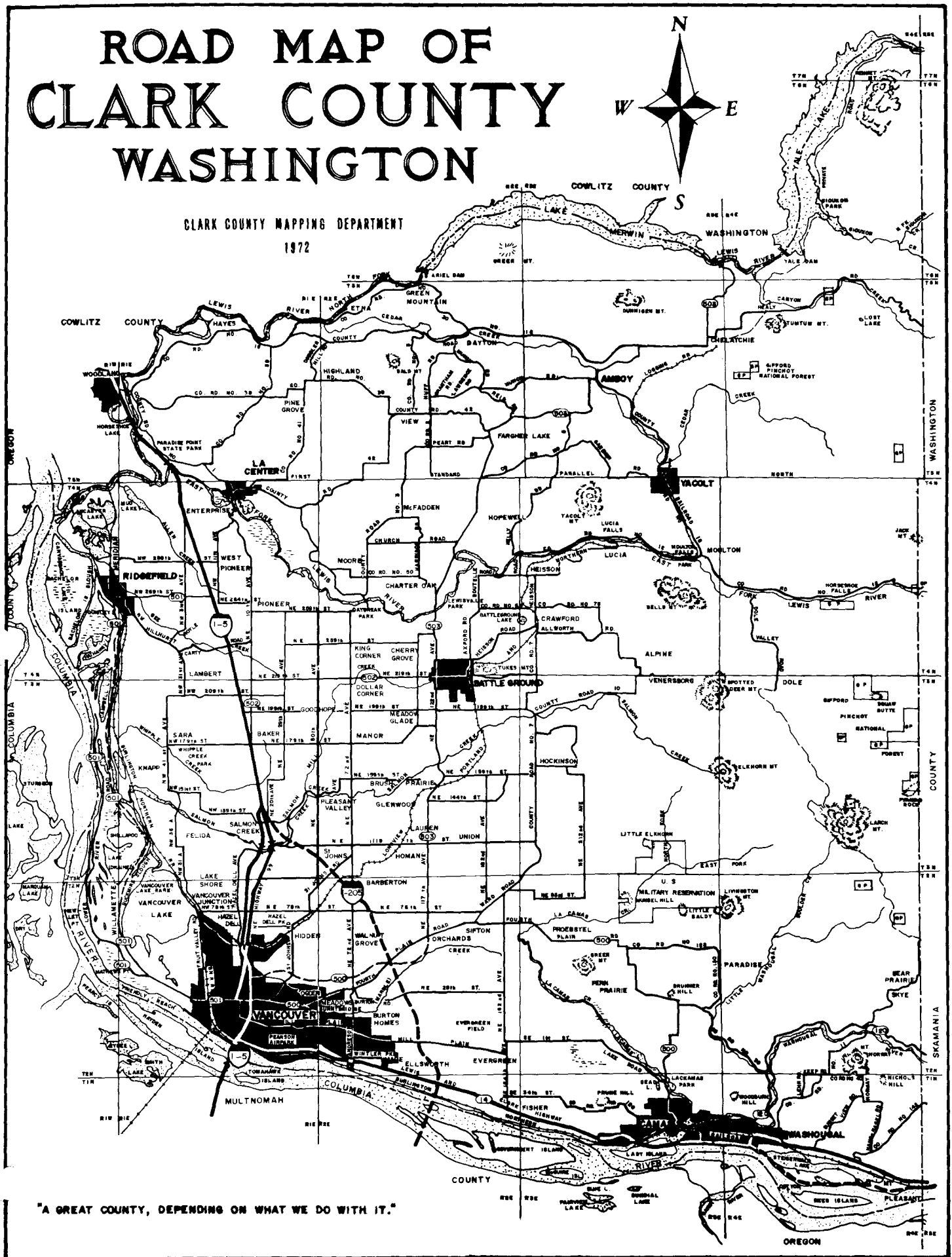

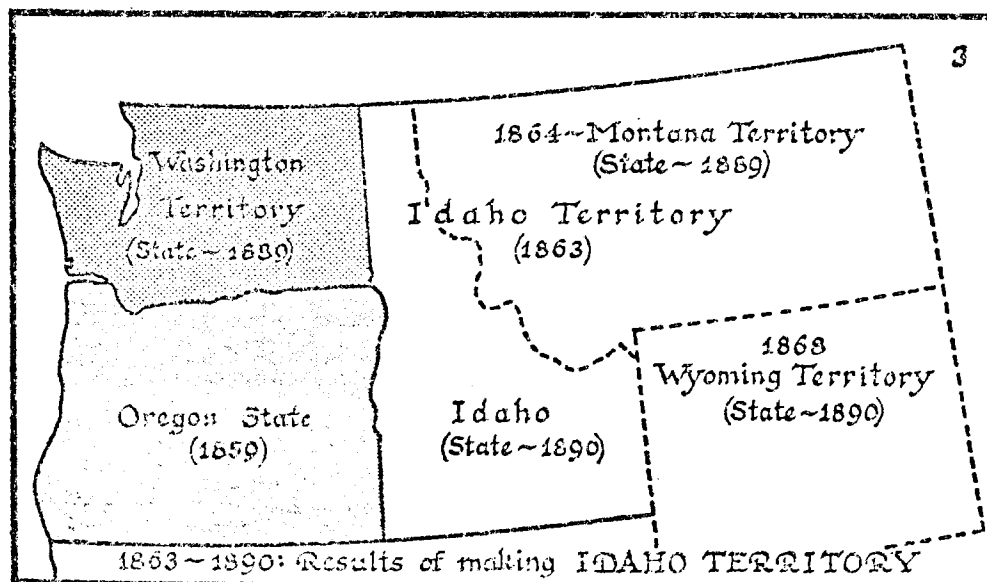
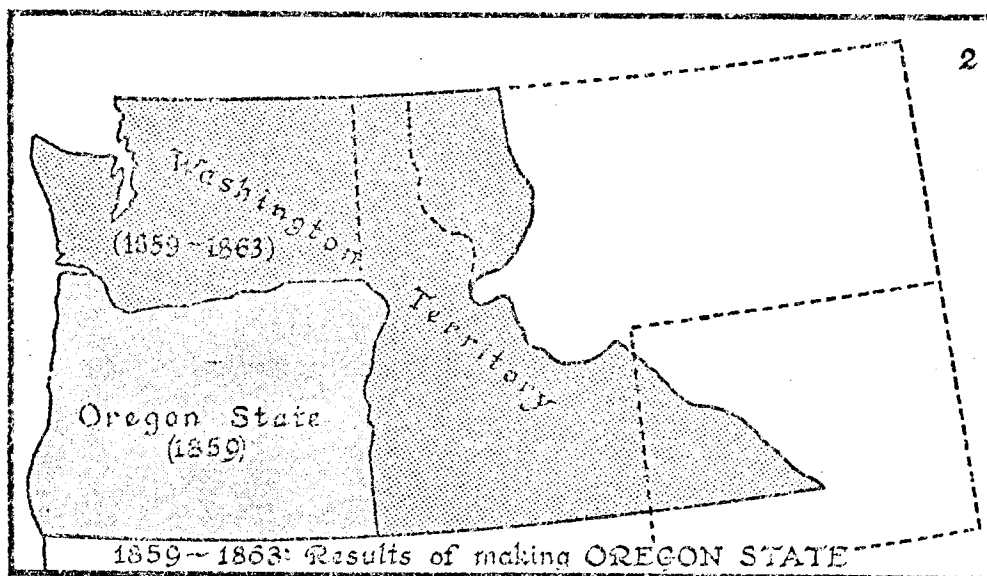
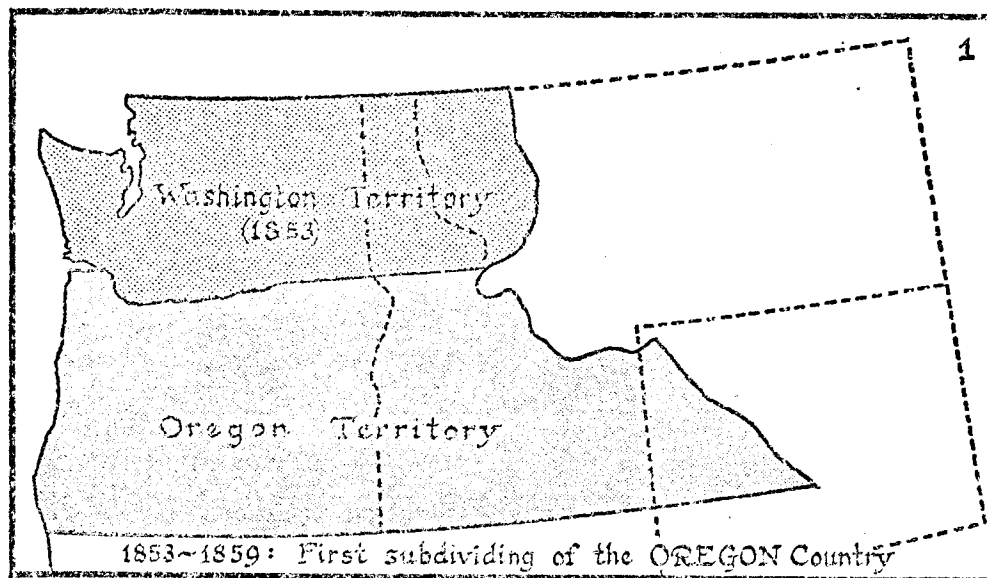
# ROAD MAP OF CLARK COUNTY WASHINGTON

## DUSTY PAGES

ACCOUNTS FROM EARLY NEWSPAPERS

Submitted by Mrs. Peter Solheim

The first newspaper published at Vancouver, Washington Territory was "The Vancouver Register", a weekly, published for ten years between 1865 and 1875. All but the first three issues are on microfilm at the Fort Vancouver Library. I have tried to copy or abstract notices of a genealogical interest.

Saturday, October 7, 1865, Vol. I, No. 4.

-Mr. Eddings, keeper of the Government warehouse, killed a large rattlesnake near the wharf in this city, a few days since.

-Several companies of soldiers arrived at this post a few days ago, since which thefts and depredations have been so numerous that we feel called upon to advise citizens to be on their guard.

--"An Unfortunate Affair--a soldier was shot in the west part of town and seriously, if not fatally injured by one of our citizens, Mr. G. N. Stabler, last Tuesday night about 10 o'clock." The soldier was stealing apples in Mr. Hayden's orchard.

--Drowned-- a youth, Barney Carr, in the employment of Mr. J. L. C. Durgan, was drowned Wednesday morning about 5 miles above town. Mr. James Parker tried to save him, but was unsuccessful. He has an aunt living here by the name of Drew and a mother and father living in Boston.

--Eighty-two immigrant wagons arrived in Portland last Saturday... not knowing where to find a home. There are excellent opportunities in this section...Come on!

A numerous audience attended, (front seats graced by a beautiful circle of the fair sex) and all appeared much gratified with the fun and mirth of these entertainments. There appeared to us an improvement and greater taste in the dresses of the performers, particularly in those of Miss Lloyd and Hedgecock. We bid these happy fellows success in their diversions during the "winters drear". January, 1847.

May 28, 1846

The Columbia River

The rise of the Columbia, which is earlier this year than usual, renders the navigation of the Willamette very easy up to this place, the back water being sufficient to overcome the difficulties of the Clackamas rapids. The Callapooiah, Capt. Cook, is now plying regularly between this city and Ft. Vancouver. She left the upper wharf on Saturday last, with 250 barrels of flour for Vancouver.....

January 21, 1847

.....We understand that the Columbia river is likewise fastened with the fetters of the "ice king". (frozen over like Clackamas and upper Willamette)

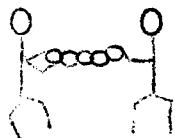

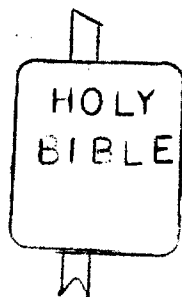

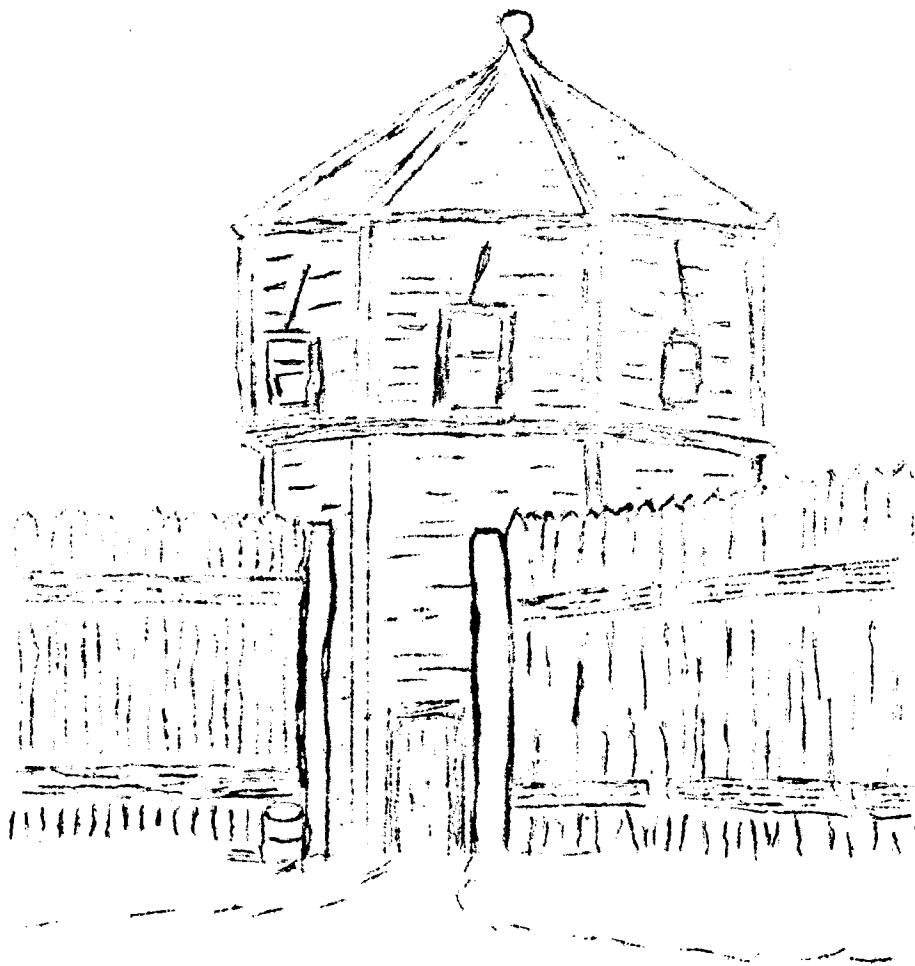

I am attempting to trace my husbands genealogy thru just the blood-line of an inherited illness called Huntington's Chorea of which he is afflicted. The research doctor told me a true blood-line to Old Country death records might aid medical research.

The illness is ranging to the whole family and finally fatal -- each child stands a 50% chance of inheriting it. It never skips a generation. We have our line back to an Alexander and Mary Ream, but due to no health records we don't know which one passed on the illness. So must trace all their lines further back to the Old Country. We have one of her lines Geo. Peter Baker (her great grandfather!), born about 1610 in Strsbourg, Germany (then).

## CLARK COUNTY HISTORY

## ULYSSES S. GRANT ( 1822-1885 )

As a first Lieutenant, ULYSSES S. GRANT was assigned to garrison duty at Ft. Vancouver, Oregon Territory, from September 20, 1852 to 1853. Altho Grant was very pleased with the area and planned to have his family join him to live here after his retirement, this was not to be. He was promoted to captain and transferred to Fort Reading, CA.

Ulysses was christened by the name of Ulysses Hiram, but through an error in his application for U.S. Military Academy at West Point, was called Ulysses Simpson from that time. He was born in Point Pleasant, Ohio. He became the 18th President of the United States-- 1868-1876. He was married to Miss Julia Dent on August 22, 1848. His military skill during the Civil War is well known. In 1885, Ulysses S. Grant began writing his "Memoirs", but was not able to finish. His death occurred at Mt. MacGrigor, near Saratoga, New York, July 23, 1885; and a mausoleum overlooking the Hudson River in upper New York City marks his resting place.

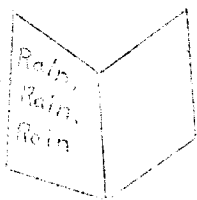

ACCOUNTS FROM EARLY NEWSPAPERS

Submitted by Mrs. Peter Solheim

The first newspaper published at Vancouver, Washington Territory was "The Vancouver Register", a weekly, published for ten years between 1865 and 1875. All but the first three issues are on microfilm at the Fort Vancouver Library. I have tried to copy or abstract notices of a genealogical interest.

## SEARCH FOR GERMAN ANCESTORS

It wasn't until I retired about two years ago that I became interested in genealogy. Then, after observing my wife gathering information on her family history and after visiting several cemeteries with her as she searched for her ancestors, I started thinking about my own family tree.

But three of my four grandparents had immigrated to the United States from Germany, and the parents of my fourth grandparent had immigrated from Germany. It didn't take long to gather the history of my family in America. To cross the barrier of the Atlantic looked hopeless to me, so I felt defeated almost before I started.

Then I remembered an address book that was found among my mother's personal belongings when she died almost ten years ago. Here I found two names with German addresses. I thought they were probably distant relatives, but had no idea how old these addresses might be. Even if these people were still alive, could they read English and would they answer a letter? I wrote to both parties, adding after their names on the envelopes the words "or families". Of course I included two international reply coupons in each letter.

To my surprise I received answers to both letters. In each case the person addressed had died, but the postmaster had forwarded my letter to descendants. So now I am corresponding with two distant cousins in Germany, one on my maternal grandmother's line and the other on my maternal grandfather's line. Both have furnished me considerable information and many photographs. And with their help I have received church records on both families, one for three generations and the other four generations. These church records give evidence that I may be able to go back still further; only time and more correspondence will determine the end of these lines for me.

I should mention that in my case I have found that many people of my age in Germany do not read or write English. But their children are studying English in the schools today. Some of the younger generation are acting as interpreters for my cousins and type their letters in English. At the present time I am attending an evening German class at the local community college. I hope to learn enough of the language so I can eventually write to my new found cousins in their native tongue.

I hope my experience will encourage others who have ancestors in foreign lands to follow up on any addresses they can find. Remember that most churches in foreign countries maintain excellent genealogical records--many of the records were not destroyed by two world wars as one might suppose.

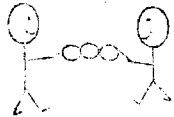
A final reminder--anyone who receives genealogical material from old church records should be sure to reimburse the church a reasonable amount. This creates good will and enhances the image of all genealogists. One of my cousins advised me that the pastor was pleased with my small donation, and that he had remarked "So many people forget the church after they get what they want".

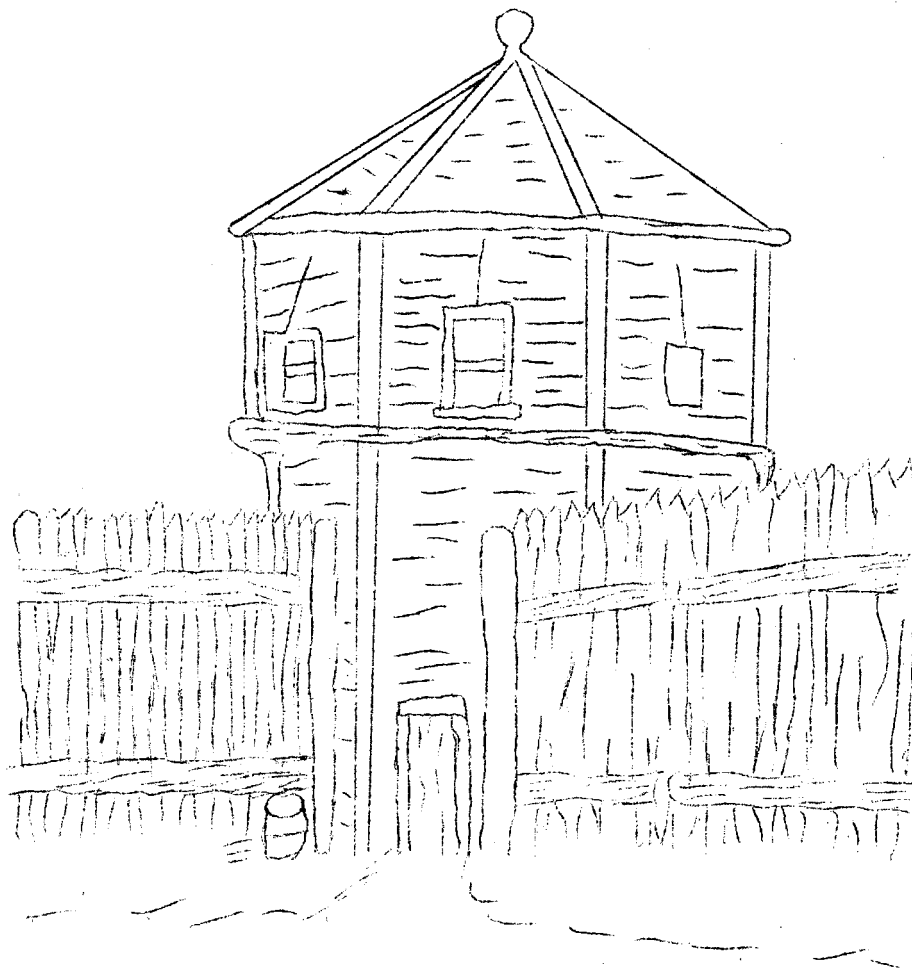

### CLARK COUNTY HISTORY VANCOUVER

The first mayor of the Village on the bank of the Columbia was Levi Farnsworth. Serving with him on the Council were: Samuel P. Marsh, president; H. F. Stryker, clerk; & Hiram Cochran, recorder. A Sabbath day closure law was one of the first passed by the council. J. E. Brant was then president. The common council changed members often, usually from one meeting to the next and most every meeting had to be adjourned because of a lack of a quorum.

From an 1860 survey of the Pacific Northwest Terr. by the Federal Government, the following properties were listed in Vancouver: a steam sawmill, hotel, and 2 wharves along the Columbia; 2 dwellings, 2 saloons 2 hotels, and 7 stores on Main St. between First and Second; a law office, tailor, market, fruit store, 2 booteries, liquor store, general store, drug store, hotel, 2 saloons, and a "residence of a Chinaman" between third and Fourth; a bakery, confectionery, bookstore, post-office, general store, saloon, cabinet shop, blacksmith, wagon shop and 6 homes from Fourth to Fifth; a jewelry shop, 2 halls, a hotel, saloon, and 4 dwellings from Fifth to Eight street. From Eight to Twenty-sixth, were eight houses and a hennerly.

In the late 1860's a match factory was constructed by A. H. Sheffield, a soap factory by Louis Sohns & D. A. Conlisk. A furniture dealer and undertaker was Joseph Westfall.

The first ten years of Vancouver history saw much improvement for a typical frontier town on the banks of the Columbia River.

In the listing, we have tried to keep family names together. Where the relationship is certain, ditto marks are used under the surname, while other names not so obvious are again capitalized.

Something is lost by alphabetizing names in a cemetery, because there is often an evident relationship shown by the proximity of graves.

For instance on p 22, Vol I No 2, is listed: POWELL, Emma L. 1879-1971, his mother, below the name, HARRINGTON, Allan L. 1897-1958. This is clearer than cross reference, as both names can be found in the index. There is a list of the data on Military burials, which we shall try to obtain for a future publication.

This completes the information we have on the FISHER'S CEMETERY as of October 1974.

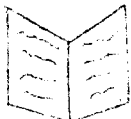

## DUSTY PAGES

The first newspaper published at Vancouver, Washington Territory was the "Vancouver Register", a weekly, published for ten years between 1865 and 1875. All but the first three issues are on microfilm at the Fort Vancouver Library. I have tried to copy or abstract notices of a genealogical interest.

The Vancouver Register, Dec 30, 1865, Vol I, No. 15

Fatal accident-- we regret to learn that Mr. N. Henrickson of Forest Grove, Oregon was killed Saturday last. (Threshing machine exploded, part hitting him in the head) Mr. Henrickson was a native of Denmark. He settled in Vancouver in 1858 where he has since lived until two years ago, moving to Forest Grove. Worked hard and helped bring two brothers over here. He was unmarried and about 30 years of age.

Kit Carson visited General Pope about 10 o'clock this morning and had a somewhat lengthy interview.

Notice--action for divorce. George A. Rohrer, Plaintiff, Mary Ann Rohrer, def., two minor children, no grounds stated.

Sad accident-- we learn from the Pacific Tribune that a child of Mr. Harrison Roe of Steilacoom (near Tacoma), about two years old was burned to death the 28th ultimo.

Parsneps-- Mr. John Tooley, sen, presented us yesterday with a pair of very respectable parsneps, the largest of which measured just 3 feet and three inches in length and 17 inches plus in circumference.

The Vancouver Register, Jan 13, 1866, Vol 1, No. 18

Married-- Jany 10th, 1865 by Julius Suiste, J.P. at his residence in Vancouver, Charles Henry Wilkinson to Mrs Elizabeth Knighton. All of this place.

The Vancouver Register, January 20, 1865, Vol 1, No. 19

Nothing new.

The Vancouver Register, January 27, 1865, Vol 1, No. 20

Sad and Fatal Casualty-- a young man by the name of Henry R. Lindsay, in Yamhill County, Oregon, who was engaged in rail making, not long since, fell a tree which striking another was thrown backwards, catching the young man and fastening him to the ground where he was found dead some two weeks after.

Death of Mr. Aird-- Mr. John Aird of this place died Thursday morning last at 6 o'clock. Mr. Aird, though young, was an old resident and one of the most prominent citizens of this county, coming to this place about 7 years ago, he was 29 years old.

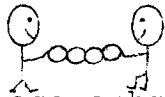

A summary of "THE CIVIL WAR DIARY OF CHARLES STETSON HAWKINS."

The summary and completed book, compiled and printed

by ALICE HAWKINS

Charles Stetson Hawkins enlisted in the 96th regiment, Company D in 1862 from Illinois where he had lived since coming from Buffalo NY by boat in 1844 with his parents when 13 years old. He married Elizabeth Ann Richards Jan 14, 1857. One son, Eugene Orville blessed this marriage.

On Oct 8, 1862, we find Charles leaving his home, wife and little 2 year old son to join his regiment at Camp Fuller for services in the Civil War. They took the train to Cincinnati, Ohio, then marched for Lexington, Kentucky.

On their way they took several prisoners and foraged the land for food. Arriving at Lexington, Nov. 14th at 11 P. M.

He only wrote this short notation in 1863, "On Jan. 16th received \$84.60 paid in full to Nov.

May 18th, 1864 we find Charles leaving Louisville, Kentucky for the front, arriving at Nashville, Tenn., the same evening. He visited John Swindle and Watson Davis at the Cumberland Hospital.

One day he loaned his knife to a fellow soldier to alter the date on his pass. The soldier went out but slipped his pass back through a crack to Charles, so they both went to town.

May 29th they left for Chatanooga, arriving June 1st. He states, "400 wounded came in from Resaca, Georgia. A great many with limbs amputated."

They stayed at Chatanooga until June 30th. At times having only coffee and sour bread to eat. On July 1st. they arrived at Big Shanty just 4 to 6 miles from the front lines. Charles helped cut brush and made a shelter for the night. Next day they left for the front lines. The rebs threw a few shells which dropped short of camp. They expected to have a brush with them but by daylight they had left with Charles and his soldiers in pursuit.

They rested for the night. Had hard tack and coffee for breakfast and continued in pursuit. Some of the boys while bathing in the river ventured out too far and was fired on by the rebs. They returned fire that night and at daylight broken and mangled horses, mules and wagons were strewn over the ground. July 6th they came upon a rebel soldier hung on a tree for deserting.

July 18th they moved about 4 miles toward Atlanta. He states, "had green apples stewed for supper. The boys brought in a rebel Colonel wounded in both arms and body. The Colonel told them he owned the farm they were camped on. Stanby uses his house for headquarters."

Advancing in close pursuit of the rebs, they came upon a burning bridge. In about 20 minutes their prisoners had another built so their troops, artillery and wagon train could pass. Placing 3 guns on a hill they shelled the woods ahead. He writes, "the rebs sent a message over in shape of a solid shot, it passed under a rail where George Carpenter sat but with no damage." July 20th he states, "fired my first big gun at the enemy!" One Company H boy was wounded in the wrist." They finished their breastworks and Tom brought their coffee. Here they stayed until July 24th. He writes, "The rebs loss in killed, wounded and missing 3000. Their calvary made a dash on the rebel railroad, captured and burned 3 trains of provisions, rescued 800 of their own men and captured the same amount of rebs. They set up sharpened sticks in front of their breastworks for the rebs to charge against, and put head logs in



the breastworks to protect them from the bullets. They captured fifty more prisoners.

July 29th he states, "Our heavy guns paid their respects to the city and rebel works, dropping shells among their 'Satanick Majestys!' Official reports are that the rebels charged our 15th corps loosing 10 thousand men killed, wounded and missing, our loss 2000 killed, wounded and missing."

He tells of 5 young women passing through their lines. He states, "They were well dressed which is a sight not often seen in the south at this present time." Sargent Scott of company G was killed by a stray shot through his lungs. Another was killed, a ball entering his side while lying in his tent. Still another of the 45th Ohio killed while sitting writing to his friends.

Aug. 25th he writes, "Some men, suffering from the heat straggled behind and was gobbled up. Al Thomas Adjutant General was captured. All's well except a scarcity of hard bread and coffee.

They marched for Macon Georgia to recapture their prisoners, doing some foraging on the way. They came upon the bodies of a rebel Colonel and four soldiers.

Sept 1st they were ordered out as train guards. Advancing slowly with the train, tearing up the tracks behind them. They captured 500 rebs and killed General Anderson. Their own General was wounded in the groin. They resumed their march stopping to rest at Jonesboro, Georgia.

Sept 3rd he states, "We had read to us, Atlanta fell into our hands Friday the 2nd of September at eleven o'clock." They marched for Atlanta camping 6 miles of the city. Sept 8th they continued their march, their brigade leading and entered the long looked for and hard fought for city.

Sept 10th he writes, "Had read to us the thanks of the President for our success in getting Atlanta." The success of the troops in Shanandoah valley was also read to them.

On Oct 3rd they marched back for Marietta, Georgia, where the rebs were tearing up the railroad tracks. They fought for the water tank, the rebs being defeated. They heard the rebs were trying to take Altoona, Georgia. So marching to Altoona they camped on the bank of the Etowah river.

Next day they marched into Resaca finding the rebs had left tearing up and burning the railroad as they went. He states, "The boys had permission to forage and the way that pork, chicken, dried apples and molasses came in was a caution." Next day they foraged again, he writes, "the mutton and chickens had to suffer again but what a shame the soldiers won't stay out of the houses, disturbing women and children."

They marched to Galesburg, Alabama. The foragers captured sixty horses all saddled and bridled plus a barrel of honey, potatoes and meat. He writes, "Raiting and Pepard have colds and fever."

Oct 8th they marched into Chatanooga and camped at the foot of Look Out Mountain. Nov 1st he writes, "Went to guard a house, had as good a place to sleep as the mans dog. He lay under the table and I on the floor by the stove. The lady had the kindness to give me a piece of corn bread for dinner which had neither salt nor shortening."

Nov. 14th he says he drew \$64/ and sent \$50. to his wife by express in care of Chas. Steel Banker, Waukegan, Illinois. Nov 11th he was excused from duty, he writes, "Pants in bad condition."

On Nov 22nd they burned all the government buildings and some ordinance stores in Polaske Tenn., then marched for Columbia Tenn.

By Nov. 28th he says their legs were badly swollen, so they crossed the river and boarded a train for Nashville.

Nov. 30 he states, " Large numbers of refugees coming into Nashville. There was heavy fighting at Franklin, 5 or 6 thousand killed and wounded on the field and one thousand prisoners. One Brigadier General and Albert Paddock was captured."

Dec. 4th we leave Charles in camp shortly after they had captured a brigade of prisoners as they crossed the river.

In 1865 he wrote only this short notation: Jan. 14th " left camp as safe guard for Mr. Wright living eleven miles northeast of Huntsville, Alabama, to all appearances a fine man and a gentleman with a good and pleasant family."

So here we leave Charles but we know he returned safely to his wife and little son and lived to greet his 8 grandchildren and several great grandchildren including my husband, his namesake.

Charles died July 7, 1913 in his sons home in Lake County, IL. northwest of Lake Villa, at the age of 82.

It is said of him, " he was a proper gentleman, large in stature, near 6 feet tall, blue eyes, brown hair, a quiet gentle nature and very considerate of others.

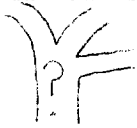

## ADDENDA AND CORRECTIONS

The 1850 Census of Clark County, O. T.--Instructions for the census taker in 1850 provided for only white, black, or mulatto in the Color category. The original census taker listed everyone not black or white as M (mulato). This included indians married to white men and their half-breed children; and the Hawaiians who lived in the Kanaka Settlement. In Vol. 1, No.s 1&2 of "TRAIL BREAKERS" the M used in the original census was changed to H.B.
