

SURPRISE CONTACT AFTER NINE YEARS

Lyman and I visited Michigan City, Indiana, in September 2012 to check out a new cemetery stone I had found on Find-a-grave that had names & dates for Simon and Pemelia Ritter and son John. This information matched what Lyman had for his great-great-grandparents and their son John who had died in the mid-1800s. We knew they were in LaPorte County because of land records. We went to the cemetery office to find out who had installed the new stone. Unfortunately, the lady had died the previous July. Her obituary named her daughters and gave her address. We located her home but it had been sold and her widower was in a care home with dementia. Daughter Lark was a minister so we visited the church, but they wouldn't share her information, so we left a letter with Lyman's contact information. Since then Lyman has taken three DNA tests, and matched another descendant of Simon Ritter, so we knew we were related. None of them knew about Peter, the oldest son, who is Lyman's great-grandfather and raised his family in Porter County, just west of LaPorte County. We gave up long ago of hearing from Lark. We were so surprised when she called us in October. She had been looking through old papers and found our letter. She was excited to find a new cousin as she didn't know many cousins. She is mailing us her mother's research and Ritter family photos.

We look forward to seeing what she sends and sharing family information. We will continue to put Lyman's contact information out there in places his ancestors lived and then hope for results. The 1950 Census may help us find living cousins.
